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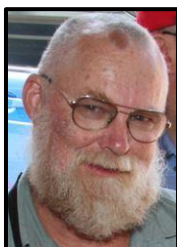

Hi all,

I would like to again put myself forward as the Grade 3 Rep for the VFT. I have held this position for the past 2 years and have thoroughly enjoyed the experience. The role is a challenging one, but a role I accept full on. One of my greatest achievements has been the implementation of the overall replacement program. This started from an idea from Murray Stevens and then the policy was drafted and Implemented by myself and John Pollard. It was a policy that a lot of work went into to get right and I firmly believe a policy that is, not only good for our club, but essential for our members.

I came into this role 2 years ago with a personal agenda and that was for Equality, and to give everybody who choose to go up to our senior grading's an equal chance to do senior roles within the club. It is work that I have started on in the backgrounds of our club and would like to be able to continue to work on it to make it come to life. Equality is everything is equal for all in the club, and a lot of work has been done by Mark Thompson and his Training committee in setting out plans for upgrades. But one thing I brought to the attention of the committee was the need for a change to the way we as a club accessed people when they were going for an upgrade of their license and that entails that everybody goes through the same process. Currently there is no set process as to what the club is required to put the person threw who is going for an upgrade, so I would like to be able to continue the work required to implement a system so that it doesn't matter what grade you are trying to achieve, you will achieve it in the same way as everybody else going for that particular grade.

A few people have said to me, and I'm sure a lot of people think to themselves, as to why I am the Grade 3 rep when I'm a Sector marshal at most events and only flag at a couple of events. One of the reasons I moved into sector marshalling was that when I got my Grade 2 it felt like a door had been shut in my face and I wasn't getting the senior opportunities that I wanted and needed to continue to develop myself further. And in talking to others this feeling wasn't mine alone as there are others who feel the same and are frustrated in seeing the same old faces getting selected to do senior roles. This is not only bad for our current Grade 3a's, 2's and 1's, but not a good outlook for any Grade 3 who may want to progress into senior roles.

So if I'm re-elected " I'll be knocking on the incoming Chief Flagmarshals door" and working on a plan that will give all of our, active trackside, grade 3a ,2 and 1 flagmarshals a minimum of 1 assistant chief role a year . I believe that with the amount of events we attend as a club we can accommodate this plus accommodate any licence upgrades that require chief/assistant chief roles to be done. I'm sure that a lot of work will need to be done to implement this or a similar plan, but I believe that it is vital for the longevity for our club that we utilize and develop all of our talent and experience within the club and not just rely on a couple of people.



This year marks my 10th in the club, and even though I can't attend Winton as much as I would like to, I don't believe that it affects my ability to represent all of the Grade 3 and 3A's as I'm as passionate as ever to make sure we further grow our club from a successful first 30 years into the next 30 years.

TRAINING MATTERS – May 2015



Well here we are at the end of another very busy Marshalling year, I'm sure you will all agree that it has been a full on 12 months with many track clashes, ongoing upgrades and general changes to the racing industry overall, however having said that, it was also a very exciting year to part of the Victorian Flagmarshalling Team. The introduction of a number of new events and the increase in our club numbers has certainly had its challenges, but it also give us as a club an opportunity to show what sort of stuff the VFT is really made of and to reflect on some of the programs we have started and to be ongoing into the years ahead.

One of the most important is Trackside mentoring, I believe this is a crucial to the ongoing skill levels of our club and its members and is an area we can all be involved in with immediate results. With an ever increasing number of new members coming through the club and flagging trackside either as a newbie or as a Grade 4, it is important that we as the seniors of the club ensure that the correct procedure, protocols and techniques are fostered to our new arrivals, however please be mindful that Mentoring is not training, mentoring gives our fellow members a "go to person", a person that is happy to share their experiences and skills and advice when required. The training committee has resurrected the Mentors form for use at all circuits, however with some of the changes by CAMS there will be a new document available in the new year, so those of you that are interested in becoming a mentor, please let me know and we will get you into the program. With the input of our seniors and our "on point check list" this will ensure that not only will all our people be up to speed on the whys and how of the point, their individual duties and of course our flags and boards, they will also be well informed about the point and its idiosyncrasies, after all, most of our seniors have worked these flag points at most tracks time and time again. This on point check form covers such things as escape routes, engineering issues to report (albeit limited), fire extinguishers, brooms, flags, medics and recovery, personal protection equipment to name but a few. The on point check list is the responsibility of the senior on point and will be completed and handed to the Chief Flag, Assistant Chief Flag or training officer during their rounds. Please be sure if you are the senior on point, don't forget to pick up a check list each morning at muster.

We have also had many reviews of the Upgrade Process and have yet again made a few changes to the format, soon to be on the VFT website will be the revamped criteria for each upgrade together with the new forms, don't forget that it's *your responsibility* to hold onto your assessment form if you are undergoing an assessment, it will also be the responsibility of the senior who is doing your assessment to complete a debrief each day using a debrief and check off form and if you are considering an upgrade please talk to your grade rep so you can be fully informed of the responsibilities, criteria and requirements for your proposed grading.

I am happy to say that we have had the following successful upgrades for 2015 together with quite a number to be completed in 2016. I take this opportunity to congratulate those people who completed their upgrades and I look forward to working with those who are ongoing. Please see below the numbers.

Some of our ongoing and completed projects are as follows;

Training Expo – Well another successful Expo was run in 2015 in conjunction with CAMS, it was a huge success with many contributors from around the country and also the appearance of the CAMS AOC to add to our long list of presenters. Thank you again to all the club members who attended and contributed to

this special event. We have certainly set the way forward for our interstate buddies that have already held very successful Expo Days in both SA & QLD this year. I expect that this event will gain even further momentum in the coming years.

Mentoring Project – We are still in the throes of formulating a Mentoring Program in conjunction with CAMS for the New Year 2016.

Upgrade Procedures - As for the upgrade procedures, we are reviewing the whole set up over the break to see if we can get it bedded down once and for all.

Flag Point Check List – All going well with some good feedback, however it is importation that they are picked up by the senior on point, or at least have some in your kit, we will make sure they are available at each meeting. We welcome any constructive comments on how it can be improved.

Trainee Sector Marshals – Observers - Grade 2 & 3 for Observer Role (Tango) – We encourage people to put their hand up for consideration and suitability to the role. As you know it's not everyone's cup of tea, however if you have attended the Sector Marshals Workshop then ask for an interview to be considered for the role.

I Pad Incident Report Project – Importance of accuracy in our reports, after all it can have a big impact on the drivers future in the sport. Trials at Phillip Island were put on hold by V8 Supercars for a number of reasons, e.g. Wi Fi availability etc however we will be hoping to hold some Report writing workshops into the New Year.

Video Training Programs – These short programs are a work in progress and will cover most of the topics listed in the training e.g. person protection, setting up you flag point, black flag relay etc, and other areas such as report writing etc, so watch this space. Again, I thank Glenn Rochester for his contribution and enthusiasm to get this off the ground.

EA Assessments - I do ask that if you are doing an assessment, please be sure to keep your paperwork with you, as for the people doing the EA, CAMS have released a memo regarding the EA assessment and how they have to be conducted with accuracy and by the guidelines, so coming into the new year we will get the procedure underway.

Overseas representation – We as a club are very fortunate to be recognised as one of the leading Officials organisation throughout the world, an accolade that we all should be very proud of, we are also fortunate to have a number of our people who are regularly selected by CAMS to represent Australia at world events such as the Singapore, Russian Grand Prix, not forgetting our very own Natalie Diash who was selected as an WAMS ambassador, again this testimony to the level of training that our club has to offer.

Whilst we had a fairly ambitious list of objectives for 2015 we managed to get quite a few of them squared away however we still have a little way to go to achieve all of our objectives;

1. Have all of our 3A's complete the Event Assessors course.
2. Have our induction video presentation completed.
3. Report writing course.
4. Get our members through race control to name a few.

As you all know, coming into the New Year there will be a new committee elected and that alone will bring about change, new challenges and interesting points of view therefore I encourage you all to contribute to make a difference and to add your thoughts and ideas to the year ahead. I would like to thank my Training Committee Team for 2015, Terry O'Callaghan, Arthur Cooksley, Tony van den Dungen, Glen Rochester, Daniele Bell, Simon Batson, Paul Meade & Kevin Watson for their support and commitment to making the VFT the club it is today, it's been great working with you all. THE KINDNESS FACTORY

I've borrowed the name but, you'll love this!



Kindness and politeness is not overrated at all. They are underused! Tommy Lee Jones

HAPPY NEW YEAR EVERYONE! I heard Melbourne's Lord Mayor Robert Doyle only moments into 2016 say his new year's resolution was to do an act of kindness every day. It never ceases to amaze me how powerful is a simple act of kindness that can completely change the outcome of one's day.

Listen to the story of one such experience and think how we can be the change maker. The Kindness Factory was created by Kath Koschel, a former elite cricketer whose life spiraled into despair and darkness without warning. She fought through the horrible ordeal however, and emerged with a renewed passion for life and a complete understanding of just how powerful kindness can be.

In 2011 Kath made her debut for NSW against South Australia on the famous Adelaide Oval, but no sooner had her career started it came to an abrupt halt. Kath sustained a back injury and just a few months later developed complications from surgery that saw her go within 24 hours having her leg amputated.

It was only Kath's sheer stubbornness that had prevented surgeons from removing the dying limb sooner. At the eleventh hour her persistence was rewarded when professionals discovered a small bleed in her abdomen that was limiting the blood flow to her leg. Emergency surgery fixed the bleed – her leg was saved. It was during this period whilst attending rehabilitation that Kath met Jim. There was an instant connection.

Jim had a smile that could make all of the worries of the world disappear. He was the type of man that made everyone feel welcome. They fell in love, and planned a future together. Jim was Kath's light in this otherwise dark journey.

With a heavy blow, tragedy struck again for Kath in 2012 when Jim passed away; taking his own life. Kath's new light was snuffed out and her journey plunged into darkness once again. Kath's recovery from the mental and physical trauma was a tough one. But throughout it all one thing shone out – the kindness of others who simply wanted to help.

They were small gestures, like offering to help her with a door, but they all helped Kath feel a little bit better. Little things were adding up to make a really big difference. While on the journey to recovery, on Australia Day 2014, Kath Koschel was awarded the Pride of Australia Medal as someone who had shown courage in overcoming adversity. This courage Kath attributes not to herself, but to the power of kindness shown to her by others.

With a new understanding of just how powerful kindness can be, Kath launched the Kindness Factory on 13th November 2015 to encourage people to show a little kindness in their community, and to share experiences of kindness shown to them. It would be sad to allow such an opportunity to be missed or that we lose the art of showing kindness in the simplest of ways.

After all... **One small act of kindness can make a really big difference.**
