CAMS Report

Hi all,

I recently attended a State Council meeting.

Before the meeting started we had a presentation from the representatives from Targa Florio. Targa Florio has been running in Italy since 1906 and was classed as a race from 1906 until the 70's then from the 70's onwards classed as a regularity. Run in one of the most enchanting Italian regions, Sicily, the race has always started and finished in Palermo, after an overall route of 600-700 kilometres. This year they are bringing the same concept to Victoria and the event will be held from the 29th November until the 3rd December. Entries are open for Classic cars from 1906 until 1976 and Ferrari's from 1977 onwards. Entry price is \$8,500 and includes all accommodation and meals. The meeting started and we went straight into elections for the 2018 Victorian State Council Executive. Positions were open for 1/2 of the Victorian State Council Executive and the results of the elections are as follows:

- Victorian State Council Executive Members (1st January 2018 to 31st December 2019) – Graeme Williams, Peter Bready, Noel Tippet, Peter Valentine

Once the elections were finished we got into the meeting and the first issue raised was a response from a motion that was raised at the previous meeting about Junior licences. The following is what was produced in the minutes from the meeting:

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES VSC1193

J. Harper advised the council in regards to action item VSC1190 from September meeting – That the board has considered the motion, and while they won't be changing the junior licence fee to \$15.00, the price will be kept on hold with no increase at \$35.00 for 2018. Following years the price will be raised following CPI as per other licences.

N. Gowers provided some of the statistics which were presented to the board for consideration regarding junior participation and licencing, which influenced the decision. Discussion in regards to junior licence prices ensued.

M. Balcombe put forward the following motion – That the board implement a \$10.00 Junior Come & Try licence for the period of 2018, to gather the market research and information that they require to support a reduction in junior licence fees. Moved by M. Balcombe, seconded by D. Bellenger

CAMS produced some statistics that showed that the cost of a Junior licence was cheaper than most other sports and that there was no evidence that reducing the licence fee would increase numbers. So the motion was to make the come and try day licence \$10 for the day for a year to gather the market research that CAMS wanted.

It was raised by Lee Filiponi from the Victorian Superkart Club that club level karting is currently struggling and noted several factors contributing to this. Concern about CAMS not taking the issue seriously and that karting, as a feeder to circuit racing will have a flow on effect. Lee told the council that there used to be about 5 companies that were dedicated to supplying the karting groups but



that is now down to 1 company and it was suggested that although CAMS don't run Go karts they should be taking direct approach in trying to help in this situation as the flow on effects to circuit racing could be huge in the future.

Ken Innes Irons from the Victorian Historic Racing Register enquired as to reasons for discrepancies between FIA and CAMS historic race meetings, specifically the 130% rule. He claims that it has changed into a rule instead of an advisory. It has been claimed that there are Historic cars and drivers out there that won't enter events now because of this rule. It was stated that this is still an advisory and is up to the Clerk of Course as to how the rule is applied.

That was the last State Council Meeting for the year and no dates for next year's first meeting have been set as yet.

Polo shirt Update

The order for the polo shirts has been placed and I'm expecting delivery mid December. It will be a close call if they will arrive before our Xmas party but we will inform everybody as to when they will be available to purchase. For those of you that haven't seen the sample shirt, it looks great and, I believe it will be a great addition to our uniform.

The Women of Australian Motor Sport (WAMS) Committee congratulates Rebecca Armstrong from Victoria as the 2017 recipient of the Virgin Australia Supercars Trans-Tasman Female Officials Exchange program.

VASC, WAMS and the Women in Motor Sport New Zealand (WiMNZ) organisations have again joined forces to continue the officials exchange program that is aimed at strengthening ties across the Tasman when it comes to female participation in motor sport.

The program provides Armstrong with the opportunity to work at the 2017 ITM Auckland SuperSprint in November, along with New Zealand official Shelly Mc Saveny to work at the 2017 Supercheap Auto Bathurst 1000 in October.

Her first official event as a flag marshal in 2014, Armstrong started her foray into motor sport in the customer service tent at the Formula 1 Grand prix. Given a pamphlet from an official, she began flag marshalling, and was awarded the Victorian Flagmarshalling Teams' President's Award in 2014 and the 2015 Club Person of the Year. Now one of the Inductions Officers helping new officials find their feet when first attending events, she is passionate about introducing and mentoring women into the sport whilst continuing to hone her skills.



"I am very excited to be working with WiMNZ and Virgin Supercars at such a fantastic event" said Armstrong. "I always want to be able to build on my skills by working with as many people as I can from other states as well as other countries and learning from their methods and processes so in turn I can help others. I'm very proud to be awarded this opportunity from WAMS to help promote women in motor sport."

The VASC Trans-Tasman Female Officials Exchange is an extension of the highly successful WAMS Officials Exchange program which is now in its fourth successful year of sending female officials to gain work experience



between signature Australian motor sport events and the Singapore Grand Prix. WiMNZ recently announced Shelly Mc Saveney as the New Zealand recipient of the opportunity to work as an official at the 2017 Supercheap Auto Bathurst 1000 in October. Mc Saveney fulfils various roles at the club-run events at Mike Pero Motorsport Park (Ruapuna) including clerk of the course, competitor relations and documentation. She has just received her gold clerk of the course licence, making her one of around 35 people in New Zealand with this level of certification to run motorsport events.

WAMS Committee member and Officials Working Group representative Dr Karyn Lun said that Armstrong was an outstanding applicant for 2017 Virgin Australia Supercars Trans-Tasman Female Officials Exchange program, and thanked those who also applied for the opportunity.

"Although Rebecca is relatively new to motor sport, she has received significant recognition from her peers, and we are confident that she will gain much from her experience in Pukekohe," said Dr Lun. "We look forward to hosting Shelly from New Zealand at Bathurst later this month, and we would also like to thank our WiMNZ counterparts and Virgin Australian Supercars for continuing to support this important program which recognises and promotes the involvement of women in motor sport."

First F1 Overseas Event – Singapore

Since I joined VFT I have enjoyed some fantastic Race meets from our small state rounds to Supercars, Bathurst 1000, Bathurst 12hr and AGP. We are so lucky to be able to enjoy so many events both locally and interstate where I know many of us have been able to go up north or over to Tasmania and enjoy participating at Supercar Events.

I have heard many a good story from those who have been going to Singapore F1 over a number of years and how much they have enjoyed this event, so this year I thought I would give it ago that is if I could get in, being it was their tenth year anniversary - maybe they would have enough Marshals.

So, when applications open I filled out the details and waited and waited and then I received an email saying I have been accepted pending some paperwork I needed from CAMS and copy of my recent events to be sent over to Singapore. Well, I wasted no time in getting that done and within a couple of weeks got the official acceptance letter with details to download an App to keep up to date with their newsletters and info when it comes to hand, a bit like what we use for Supercars now. Uploaded a photo of myself for our pass and then it was just a matter of waiting out about 4 months but in this time I booked my accommodation and airfares and was fortunate enough to get a hotel only 15mins walk from Muster.

With some helpful information from Officials who have been over before and some contacts I made in Singapore from visiting Marshals to our AGP I felt set to go with a few days each side of the event for sightseeing.

Tuesday 12th Sept my flight left Melbourne with the arrival time in Singapore 6pm their time which would allow me to pick up my credentials before they close at 8pm, but I had a backup plan, for everyone knows you can't trust airlines to be on time and good thing I did because we were an hour late and by the time the bus dropped me off at the hotel it was 7.45pm - no time to get to Muster. But I had arranged for my sector to pick it up in case I was late, we had kept in contact on Whats app. You need your pass to access the track - the rest of my gear I would pick up on Thursday night when we were required to be at the track for testing and setup. Muster was not open on Wednesday so no other opportunities to pick gear up.

Even though I was late Local Marshals still met me and took me out for dinner and drinks and this is how it was all week - taken places, great food, great company - just a fantastic placeI have fallen in love with Singapore.... Just like to thank Amanda Chew, Jia Ying, Teo Chih, Yuan Jimmy and my Sector Gengwhy for looking after me and taking me out for some of the best food Singapore could offer. They just looked after me so well plus the many others that I met each morning for coffee before we went over to Muster and the Team at Turn 19. What a w/end with Ericsson hitting the wall in practice and the Porsche on fire, stopping between 19 and 20 and the road flooding on Sunday.

I worked Flags and Light Panel staying on the Light Panel for the main race Sunday - what a great spot with views of the Singapore Flyer and fireworks after the race.



Each day we started at around midday for sign on and lunch before going track-side. Most days it was 3pm before we had anything on track with Porsche and Ferrari being the only support races but the Ferraris did look great. We finished up around 10:30pm most nights and I was in bed around 1:30am most mornings because you just don't go straight home, you go out for food and drinks - that's the good thing about not having to get up early the next day.

How good it was on Saturday to hear that they got another 4 years in Singapore. I am glad. This now gives me the opportunity of getting back to do it all over again. I could write pages of my adventures but it just would be the same. All I can suggest is if you have a wish list, whether it be Singapore or another track in Australia or the world, don't put it off, do it. Even though some of the way we do things may be different we have this wonderful family of marshals all over the world with the same love of motorsport and it is a great learning opportunity to see how things are done elsewhere.

Flag Rules.

Over the past few months there have been some discussions about some Flag Rules. Unfortunately the rules are often open to interpretation and can often have variations or be changed by the Clerk of Course, weather conditions or the type of race meeting you are attending e.g. Historics. It's only through your trackside experience and training that you can confidently execute the use of the flag signals with accuracy and timing. There are a number of books available that explain the Flag Rules: the CAMS Rule Book; VFT Rule Book and the FIA Rule book all with same intent but can have some slight variations of the Flag rules. It's important to listen at morning briefings in case there is a



change to any of the flag rules for the current meeting. Not forgetting it's only you that can make the decision and control the situation when standing trackside at the flag point, after all, you have the best view of the incident in question. If in doubt put it out or seek advice from your fellow flaggies or seniors on point, alternatively discuss it with the Chiefs during their visit to your point.

Let's start off with Lack of Adhesion Flag – Yellow with Red Stipes

This Flag is held stationary to inform drivers that there is a deterioration of track adhesion ahead due to Oil, Water, Dirt, or Stones etc on the track in the area beyond your point and possibly up to the next point. This Flag is normally displayed for at least 4 laps unless the track returns to normal earlier or race control asks you to continue to display the flag until instructed to withdraw by your Sector Marshal or Race Control – this can also be dependent on the severity of the surface degradation as to how long you may wish to display the flag. It's up to you to keep a check on the situation.

Remember this flag is not used to cover debris on the track that is likely to cause damage to a vehicle if they were to run over it, in which case a Yellow Flag would be displayed. Remember if you can drive through it you use the Lack of Adhesion Flag, if you need to drive around it, it's a Yellow Flag. Also, it is ***not necessary*** for the following point to display a Green Flag.



Again, a reminder to you all, we as the training committee are at your disposal should you have any training requirements. If you wish to schedule an assessment, please let the Chief know when putting your name down to attend a meeting. My team and I look forward to working with you so please be sure to let us know of your intention to attend race meetings so we can do some forward planning.
