This state of affairs could be a reason for dwindling numbers.

In closing I would like to thank: the Vice President, David Thornbury, for ably chairing meetings in my absence; Matt Cornford, for stepping in to fulfil the onerous role of Treasurer, a task he carried out admirably; Eric Rigg, our extremely diligent Secretary; Arthur Cooksley, Chief Flagmarshal; Jason Carroll, for enduring at times a rather frustrating year as CAMS Rep; as well as Mark Thompson, Chief Training Officer; also Shane Rogers, Grade 4/5 Rep, again with frustration; and William Gaff, Assistant Chief Flagmarshal.

It would be remiss of me not to thank several other people for their work on behalf of the club; namely the Training Committee; Merchandise Officer; and the various meters and greeters at the gates of circuits to usher in prospective new officials. And last and certainly not least the Editor of our club magazine, Joy Chirnside. I have the privilege of witnessing first hand the work that goes into producing an excellent newsletter.

My thanks to each and every one of you who attended the many race meetings throughout the year and I look forward to 2018 with optimism.

A Quick and Amazing Trip to Paris

(I knew that Roger wouldn't wish to write an article about his own achievement so I thought I would do it for him!!)

It all began with a phone call on Friday 10th November from the President of CAMS whilst Roger was officiating at the Sandown Historic meeting. After Roger recovered from the initial shock of being informed that he had been named as the recipient of the prestigious FIA Outstanding Official of the Year, to be awarded at no lesser venue than the Palace of Versailles in Paris on **8 December**, it was time to do some quick planning! Not only did I have to renew my passport in a hurry as I had less than 6 months left on it, but we had to sort out dates for flights and accommodation and appropriate dress for a black tie event! In addition we had two grandchildren due at the end of November (to separate sets of parents), very special events that we didn't want to miss out on!

Roger's flights and two nights accommodation were paid for as part of receiving the award, so we paid for my flights and an extra couple of nights accommodation so that we could at least relax after the big event and see some of the sights in wintertime – which we did and thoroughly enjoyed!

And so, on the evening of 6 December, after the safe arrival of two gorgeous grandsons a few days earlier, we were on our way to Paris! We were met on arrival at the airport next afternoon and taken by chauffeur driven car to the Hotel InterContinental Le Grand in the centre of a very cold Paris, close to the Paris Opera House and near to the FIA's headquarters. As the FIA Prize Giving ceremony has been the traditional closing event of the FIA Annual General Assembly Week since 2011, there were FIA banners everywhere around the hotel as the majority of the meetings were taking place in the hotel's function rooms.



There were certain formalities to be completed upon arrival with regards to the Prize Giving evening, which were then followed by a very brief sightseeing stroll near to the hotel in the cold evening air.

The next afternoon, Friday 8th December, was spent making sure all the creases and wrinkles from a very long flight had been ironed out, before boarding a coach for the police escorted trip to the Palace of Versailles, some 21kms from the hotel, on the outskirts of Paris. We initially wondered why there were so many police on motorcycles with lights and sirens everywhere, until we realised that at every intersection between the hotel and the Palace the police were stopping all other traffic to allow our convoy of 8 plus coaches through! Obviously the FIA has a lot of clout in Paris!



On arrival at the Palace, after a light sprinkling of snow, we were welcomed via a red carpet through a French Guard of Honour to the sound of royal drums.

The first hour or so was spent walking through the palace, accompanied by chamber music with the musicians and singers all dressed in XVII century costumes, and passing through the Royal Apartments, the

King's Chamber and the Hall of Mirrors. Along the way official photos were taken of all the guests and champagne was offered – and enjoyed!





Dinner took place in the Battle Gallery (Gallerie des Batailles), the largest room in the Palace, covering almost the entire first floor of the South Wing. The walls depict nearly 15 centuries of French battles through paintings that are almost floor to ceiling. There were 70 tables of guests and the event was a veritable who's who of motorsport. At a table near us were seated Sebastian Vettel, Valtteri Bottas, Max Verstappen, Toto Wolff and their partners. Lewis Hamilton wandered past as well, with his minders.

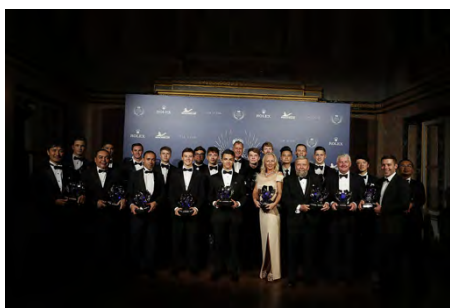


During the evening Roger was introduced to a number of dignitaries including Jean Todt, President of the FIA.

Following dinner, we continued our walk through the Palace, and on to the Royal Opera House, where the Prize Giving was to take place. Inaugurated during 1770 during the reign of Louis XV, the Royal Opera House was, at the time, the largest concert hall in Europe. The Palace of Versailles as it is today, having been added to constantly over the years, contains 2,300 rooms and

the parts that we saw were awe inspiring, especially when you consider that its origin in the 17th century was Louis XIII's hunting pavilion!

As an award recipient Roger (and I) were seated towards the front of the Royal Opera House, but many of the guests were seated in an alternate room from where they watched the proceedings on a big screen. The Prize Giving itself was split into sections as there were so many awards to be made, with some awards being given separately and others in groups. Roger was in the 'Circuits' section, a group of about 19 recipients, who, having



been given their awards backstage were then presented to the audience altogether. A few of the recipients were mentioned by name individually and Roger was very lucky to be one of these as the Master of Ceremonies thanked the "invaluable

volunteers and officials as we congratulate Roger Chirside from Australia as The Outstanding Official of the Year" (and which was followed by applause).



For those that are not aware, the award for the FIA Outstanding Official of the Year 'pays tribute to exceptionally long and dedicated careers as officials in motor sport' and as Roger commenced his officiating journey in 1966 (yes, 51 years ago!) I guess this had something to do with the award!

Some of you may know that a young (then 17 year old) British Formula 4 driver, Billy Monger, had a horrific accident at Donington back in April 2017 and as a result lost part of both legs. He is an amazing young man, determined to go on racing in the future and he received the FIA President's Award, and received a standing ovation as he walked very carefully onto the stage, on his new prosthetic legs and the aid of sticks, showing an amazing amount of courage and upstaging every other award presentation of the night!





The Prize Giving ended with all recipients being invited back onto the stage together which was quite a sight. Words can't fully describe the amazing venue of the Palace and also the grandeur of the event. It all seemed quite surreal to be a part of it.



The receiving of the trophy and the box in which to transport it home, was the culmination of an incredible event and to quote Roger: "One of the most amazing nights of my life". The fact that we were able to share it, made it all the more memorable. As Roger has since stated many times, he never realised that all those years of doing something he loved could lead to such an event, one for which he is truly humbled and honoured.

Our thanks and gratitude therefore must go to all the people concerned who made receiving this award possible and for a trip that will remain memorable for ever.

Flying with Struggles!

...you'll love this.



Quote; 'What is the difference between an obstacle and an opportunity? Our attitude toward it. Every opportunity has a difficulty, and every difficulty has an opportunity.' —J. Sidlow Baxter

I live near Fountain Gate Shopping Centre and was blown away by how many shoppers there were everyday through November and December, filling the carparks and overflowing all the kerbs and parklands surrounding the centre over Christmas. Abandoned trollies were littered all over the area from the mountainous loads of presents they had carried out from the shops.

There is much debate of this new generation whether our children have been given so much that they now expect everything all at once. Not satisfied with what they have; they want everything right now, not tomorrow, but right now. I think we have spoiled our children to expect more than they ought and expect it all the time. It may seem odd to think we aren't teaching our children to fly in the face of struggles. You can't fly through life without there being seasons of struggles.

Life is not just about having everything you want or desire without the effort and sometimes the failures that are encountered. The effort and dedication it took to get where one is today. Part of good parenting is teaching the youngsters the steps it took for people to arrive at their present.

The good book says that teaching perseverance develops endurance and endurance, reward. What do you know that can be done without a bit of struggle? Acquiring an education, or learning a new skill, or developing a successful business, an accomplished painter, musician, or athlete? Make the decision now to not let struggles steal anything away from you and plan a very satisfying year.
